

Chandrayaan-3, also known as the Indian Moon Mission 3 or India's third lunar exploration mission, was a followup mission to the Chandrayaan-2

objective primary Chandrayaan-3 was to further explore the Moon's surface, collect more scientific data, and expand our understanding of Earth's closest celestial neighbour. Chandrayaan-2, which although, did not achieve a soft landing on the Moon, was still able to orbit to successfully and extensively study its geology and atmosphere.

The Chandrayaan-3 mission's key components include a lunar lander and rover, similar to the ones used in Chandrayaan-2. The lander had more robust propulsion system to ensure a soft landing on the moon's

surface. It was launched using ISRO's Geosynchronous Satellite Launch Vehicle (GSLV) Mark III.

Chandrayaan-3 not only completed its task but also proved that India is the first and only nation to land on the moon's South Pole. This mission also showed that India is now a developing and technological nation.














I would like to ask a question "Is a blind persons' sense of hearing or smell enhanced more than a' sighted one"?

The lack of ability of an individual to sense the vision by birth or some physical changes results the condition of blindness. In such cases, their brain rewires due to the lack of visual information and sharpens the other cognitive motor movements. So the blind persons the other senses like smell, hearing, memory and touch is more powerful than the normal one. Neuroplasticity is the adaptation of the brain by rewiring by itself with motor neurons reactions. In the case of the blind ones the neuroplasticity occurs. Studies shows that the blind person can smell more than the normal one, because they are using the secondary olfactory cortex more than the sighted ones when they smell. The region of occipital cortex, normally for the vision but the blind one use this for smelling. The research shows that the sense of smell could lead to concrete applications that may help the blind one to navigate the blind one to their surroundings. For ex: the smell of food items and medicines etc.
