## **BETHANYASHRAM**

**BETHANY ASHRAM** refers to the religious congregation officially known as “**Order of the Imitation of Christ**” (**OIC**). Fr P.T.Geevarghese Panickaruveetil (the Servant of God, Archbishop Mar Ivanios) founded Bethany Ashram on 15 August, 1919, at Mundanmala, Perunad, Kerala, India. The founder and the first members entered into full communion with the Catholic Church on 20 September, 1930. On April 14, 1966, the Congregation was raised to the status of a Pontifical right. In the year 2000, the congregation was bifurcated into two provinces, namely, Bethany Navajyothy Province and Bethany Navajeevan Province. The head quarters of the provinces are situated at Desom, in Aluva and at Nalanchira in Thiruvananthapuram respectively.

The Charism of the Order of the Imitation of Christ is, to follow Jesus Christ in his life of prayer and action, realized in oriental monastic tradition and Indian Sanyasa and aimed at the evangelization of India through the spiritual renewal of the Malankara Church. To imitate Jesus in his life of prayer is to experience a sense of constant union with God through meditation, with special emphasis on the word of God, active participation in the liturgical life of the Church and the observance of the spiritual exercises and other practices prescribed in the Holy Rule of the congregation. To imitate Jesus Christ in his life of action is to follow his footsteps by proclaiming the Gospel of the kingdom of God on earth and leading people to the eternal Father.

The active life of the congregation consists of apostolic activities, empowerment of human society and ecology. Bethanian vision of education is “to mould a generation which is spiritually deep-rooted, morally upright, emotionally mature, intellectually versatile, efficient in communication, sublime in attitude, sober in behaviour and sensitive to ecological values.” We, Bethanians, try to make education an effective instrument for the transformation of human beings who are socially cultured, physically fit, mentally healthy and spiritually envisioned. It is to build up a society where the principles of social justice, equality of opportunity, freedom and respect for religious and moral values prevail.



### **HISTORY**

Girideepam had a very humble beginning in 1975 with a dozen of tiny tots in a room attached to Bethany Ashram, Kalathipady, Kottayam. The ardent fervor of Bethany Fathers synchronized with social commitment helped the School to grow by leaps and bounds doing good to society. In 1987 we presented the first batch of SSLC and since then an uninterrupted history of total pass with top State Ranks and grades continues. Hundreds of young citizens passed out of this Temple of Learning with a lamp in their hands and a song on their lips. In 2002 this School was upgraded to a Higher Secondary School.

The credibility and social commitment of this Institution called for another School with CBSE syllabus. Girideepam Bethany Central School established in 1997 is an off-shoot of Girideepam High School. This School in the same campus has grown into a full fledged Senior Secondary School and we have presented the first batch of AISSE (X) in 2001 and AISSCE (XII) in 2003. The commendable results in Board Examinations put this School in the list of top ranking CBSE Schools in the country.

Girideepam Institute of Advanced Learning (GIAL) established in 2005 is another stage in the progress of Girideepam. It is a college affiliated to Mahatma Gandhi University in the Self Financing Sector offering specially designed courses up to the Post Graduate level. The college makes every student competent and confident to live up to the challenges of the globalised world.

## **DIRECTIVES TO STUDENTS**

***Read the directives carefully and sign the declaration given on the first page of the handbook.***

- i Girideepam students are expected to behave in a becoming manner on and outside the School Campus.
- ii Students should be neat and clean in person and dress.
- iii Class rooms and school premises should be kept neat and clean.
- iv They should reach the school before the third bell and be prompt in taking part in the assembly before the class.
- v They have to come well prepared with all the lessons previously done and after doing the day's home work properly. Regular tests will be conducted, based on which, an evaluation report will be prepared and parents will be informed about the same on a scheduled date.
- vi Examinations and other activities of evaluation are compulsory to all. Any malpractice during these evaluations will be strictly punished.
- vii Politeness and courtesy of speech and conduct will be inculcated by insistence and training.
- viii Quarrelsome nature, habitual idleness, dishonesty and disobedience or

disrespect to teachers and elders will be very seriously viewed and dealt with accordingly.

- ix. Running, playing or shouting inside the school building is not allowed. No student will enter any class other than his or her own without permission.
- x. When students move along the corridors they must walk in silence and in a single file. They should always keep left.
- xi. The school shall not be held responsible in any way for any illness, injury, accident or mishap to any student, but first aid and medical assistance will be given if found necessary.
- xii. Students must be disciplined in common places like cafeteria, auditorium, bus, toilet, library, laboratory, play grounds etc.
- xiii. Students should greet in respect all teachers, staff and elders in the campus.
- xiv. Students are expected to be out of the school building within 15 minutes following the school dispersal. Only students involved in staff-supervised activities are permitted to remain in the campus.

- ☞ **Students shall not bring or wear costly ornaments, watches, mobile phone, camera or any other electronic items in school. These items will be confiscated.**
  - ☞ **Only girls are allowed to wear small earrings or studs. No second studs or second rings are permitted.**
  - ☞ **Boys and girls are not allowed to wear bracelets, bangles, chains, rings, friendship bands, tattoo or such decorations.**
  - ☞ **Girls have to keep the hair plaited or tucked with black or blue hair band or clips.**
  - ☞ **Regularly cut, properly combed hair and clean shaven face is compulsory for boys.**
  - ☞ **Fancy hair cut is not permitted. Hair colouring / hair streaking is strictly not allowed.**
  - ☞ **Nails are to be clipped close.**
  - ☞ **Low waist / skin fit / pencil fit pants are strictly not allowed. Only regular fit pants are permitted .**

- xvi If at the start of the class the teacher has not arrived, the class leader will see that order and silence is maintained. If after three minutes, the teacher has not yet arrived, the leader should send the assistant leader to inform the Principal / Vice Principal.
- xvii Students may not be summoned to answer telephone calls during class time.
- xviii Girideepam is an English medium school and its medium of instruction is English. Staff and students are expected to speak only English in the school campus.
- xix No student should absent himself/herself without prior sanction.
- xx Leave of absence must be obtained from the Principal by written application from the parent/guardian.
- xxi Repeated or extended absence of fifteen days or more without leave renders the student liable to have his name struck off the rolls. Re-admission, if granted, will only be after payment of fresh admission fee.
- xxii Students who absent themselves from Examinations for any reason other than sickness justified by a Doctor's Certificate, will be considered as having failed for that particular examination.
- xxiii Any damage or loss of the school properties caused by the students, will be notified to their parents or guardians in time and it shall be their obligation to make good the damage.
- xxiv Each student is given an identity card; and a copy of this card should be carried by the guardian or the parent for all matters with regard to the student and should be produced on demand.
- xxv Every student is responsible for the safe keeping of his or her own belongings. The school will not take up any responsibility for their loss.

## **GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS**

The school solicits your cooperation to help bring out the best in the child fulfilling the goals of education. Parents are exhorted to pay due attention to these aspects of a child's growth and work hand in hand with the school.

1. Parents are requested to go through the student handbook and be fully aware of the rules and regulations of the school.
2. The school insists on punctuality, regular school attendance, regulation regarding school uniform, cleanliness in dress, good grooming and fidelity to study and work assignments.
3. Parents should take interest in the child's academic and non academic areas of growth.
4. Parents may visit the official website of the school for necessary information on working of the school.
5. Parents may meet the teachers **on OPEN HOUSE days** to discuss matters relating to your wards.
6. Parents may meet the Principal **on weekdays between 10 am and 1 pm only.**
7. Parents are requested not to enter the classroom to see their children or teachers during school hours.
8. Parents or visitors are not allowed to move around through the corridors during class hours.
9. Parents should ensure that their children do not bring any valuables or electronic gadget / mobile phone to school. They should also discourage buying and bringing of expensive items, including stationery and other items.
10. The school discourages absenteeism and parents should not allow the students to skip classes.

11. Parents should make sure that for any absence from the school, a written intimation is sent to the class teacher.
12. Absence from school for merely social functions is discouraged.
13. Only parents are authorised to collect their child from the school. \*If a parent has an objection to rule 13, he/she may inform the Principal accordingly.
14. Parents must affix their photographs in the space given in the student handbook. A guardian's name and photo may be given on the profile page of the student handbook so that in case of an emergency where the parent is unavailable, the student can be allowed to leave with the guardian.
15. A parent/ authorised guardian requiring to collect his/ her ward must first report at the school office.
16. Special permission for a student to leave the campus must be sanctioned only by the Principal / Vice Principal.
17. Parents are advised to attend all scheduled PTMs (Parent Teacher Meetings). Parents and guardians are expected to respond seriously to any call from the school to discuss matters concerning their wards. This is essential for the welfare and progress of the students.
18. Parents are to notify the school regarding any changes in their address or contact numbers
19. Parents are to provide ample opportunities to their children to converse in English at home.
20. Parents must refrain from criticism of any teacher or authority of the school in front of their children.
21. Parents are requested to go through the fee structure and ensure that all instalments are paid on time.

Half coat : Included for Std XI (Boys)

#### **Girls:**

Shirt : Pale blue shirt with thin black stripes having three fourth sleeve and special collar..

Half coat & : Black with thin white stripes

Pants

#### **Uniform Accessories:**

School Belt : Regular Black Belt can be worn

School Badge : Included on the uniform.

Footwear : Black Shoes & Blue/Black Socks

\* Prescribed special uniform will be followed on Tuesdays & Thursdays

***All students are expected to come to school in complete uniform on all working days***

\* Students are allowed to wear only **black sandals with backstraps** for the first term during the rainy season.

\* **On normal weather days students must wear black polished shoes. Fancy or designer shoes in black colour are strictly not permitted with school uniform.**

\* Slippers/ Slippers/ Floaters are strictly prohibited.

The annual examination will cover portions from both terms. However the weightage of portions from each term for the final exam will be intimated to the students.

**For class IX :**

There will be a weightage on internal assessment (which includes periodic test performances, multiple assessment, portfolio and subject enrichment activities). The weightage on written examinations will be as per CBSE guidelines.

**For class X:**

There will be a weightage on internal assessment (which includes periodic test performances, multiple assessment, portfolio and subject enrichment activities) and external assessment will be conducted as per CBSE guidelines.

**For class XI:**

There will be a weightage each, on midterm exams and weightage each, on term end exams. Practicals/ Projects/ Assignments will carry weightage. Exam pattern will be as per the pattern provided by the CBSE.

**For class XII :**

There will be a weightage on internal assessment (practical / project work) and external assessment will be conducted as per CBSE guidelines.

## **PROMOTION POLICY**

- 1. All students must attend all tests and exams conducted by the school. Attendance in tests and exams is essential for promotion to the next class.**
- 2. A student's performance during the entire year will be taken into consideration at the time of promotion.**
- 3. A student having less than 75% attendance in an academic session shall not be permitted to appear in the Final Examination.**
- 4. For classes III to VIII : Pass criterion- 33% marks in each subject (separately and in aggregate)**
- 5. For classes IX and XI, pass criteria and promotion to the next class will be based on the guidelines issued by the CBSE.**
